The Board of Trustees of School District No. 25 advocates the development and continued support of Parent Teacher Association (PTA) or Parent Teacher Student Association (PTSA) organizations in each of the schools in the District. It is recommended that each school maintain an active PTA organization in which the principal serves as a vice president and is active on the executive committee.

The Board supports national child advocacy goals of the independent non-partisan, non-sectarian PTA/PTSA to promote child welfare and encourage parental involvement in the schools. PTA officers and members will be called upon from time to time to serve on committees which may be appointed by the Board.

The Board supports the organizations known as District 5 PTA. They will be organized under the authority of the State PTA for the purpose of conference, leadership training, and coordination of efforts of individual school PTAs and PTSAs. The District 5 PTA Board will serve as a medium of communication and representation between the local PTAs/PTSAs units and School District Administration/Board of Trustees. It is recommended that the Superintendent serve as a vice president on the District 5 PTA Board and be active on the executive committee

The elementary PTA/PTSA fund raising picture-taking project is approved for the purpose of raising funds. The funds raised from the picture project are to be used to supplement the instructional needs of the students at a school (i.e., media center, technology, etc.) The use of the funds shall be determined by a collaborative effort between the school administration, the PTA Teacher Representative, and the PTA Executive Board of that school. The funds received from this project are to be deposited in the PTA account and are to be designated for disbursement to the school for the purpose(s)/goals previously determined.

Any other PTA/PTSA fund raising utilizing school facilities, students and/or teachers must be in accordance to district fund raising policy.
